

BCHW Legislative Report by Jeff Chapman

June 2025

The State legislative session is over until the mid-biennium session starts in January, 2026. The 2025 operating budget that pays for agency salaries and hired crews was down, but that isn't surprising when considering the State's fiscal situation. We did our best to support DNR, DFW, State Parks, and the RCO as they competed for revenue with many other critical needs of our residents including housing, education, and medical care.

The bipartisan capital budget was more positive as State legislators worked to maintain capital projects for the 2025-2027 biennium. We worked to keep the grant programs fully funded in that budget, and they were. This effort will be showcased in the upcoming June 24th meeting of the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board as they approve the distribution of funding for the three grant programs we focus on:

Nonhighway and Off-road Vehicle Activities (NOVA) (Resolution 2025-18)

Recreation Trails Program (RTP) (Resolution 2025-19)

Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program (WWRP) (Resolution 2025-20)

The results are in and are listed below!! NOVA funded many good grants for DNR and for the USFS. Some didn't make the funding cutoff, like the grant for the Elbe Equestrian System Maintenance (24-2412 M). For RTP, the 3 BCHW grants are funded (note that all RTP grants are shown at ½ funding (first year) since federal revenue is each year while the state budget is for 2 years). For WWRP, the Battleground Lake equestrian parking lot was funded. Unfortunately, the Palouse to Cascades Trail project at Rosalia was pulled by legislative prerogative.

To see what was funded, look to the last "Grant Award" column. An "Alternate" project means it was not funded, but there is still a chance that it might be in the future if funds are available, particularly if it is close in ranking order to funded projects. (Projects are listed by ranking).
