

- Project description
- Funding needs/cost estimate
- Partners (if any)
- Timeline
- Existing Funding, if any
- Photos of project site

Getting Started:

- How much help do you need?
 - I can submit a grant application for you, help you submit a grant application, or simply just review your grant application and provide advice.

What's Out There For Grant Funding?

LOTS OF OPPORTUNITY – Here are a few examples:

BCHA grants - \$100 to \$1,000 online grant form and currently accepting applications until March 15th.

- National Forest Foundations Matching Awards Program (MAP) Projects located on Forest Service lands with a 1:1 match requirement (RTP funding can be used as match). Two application periods (January, already passed) and again in early spring.
- Trail Stewardship Funding: grants range from \$2,000-\$10,000
- LOTS of private sources (Polaris, Ford Motor Company, North Face, etc.)



Projects That Need Funding:

- Whatcom Bryce Cr. Camp, Heady Rd. Trailhead improvements
- Mt. St. Helens Replacing wood corrals at Rock Cr. Horse Camp with pipe corrals.
- Ponderosa Improve equestrian camp on BLM's Rock Cr. Recreation Area.
