MVBCH FEBRUARY 3, 2022 MEETING MINUTES

Treasurer's Report: (Bennet)

MVBCH has received recent donations and dues payments that have increased our overall balance. This allows us to proceed with planned trail work. Chapter members are welcome to contact Treasurer Bennet Upper for current balances if interested [contact info is on front page].

Club Calendar: Cathy distributed handouts related to work projects and proposed events. She is asking members for submissions. Bennet said it's easy to post events on the BCHW website.

Work Projects:

- * Redecking of Lewis Lake Bridge. The trail needs to be logged out in early June and an outfitter will be hired to pack in the planks.
- * Evergreen Bike Alliance has an RCO grant to do brush work on the Twisp River Trail and Lightening Creek. MVBCH can use their people to brush out the Twisp River Trail.
- * The Washington Conservation Corp will be hired to work on the Williams Creek Trail on August 4-11. The trail needs lots of tread work.
- * NSHC: Wire fencing and burying the water tank still needs to be done. MVBCH has money from the USFS to complete these projects.

Spring Ride:

- * Publicity: Megan Casey, our new membership chair, will be helping promote information for new members and updating our facebook page. MVBCH is also looking at setting up a group facebook page. Our ride is advertised through BCHW. Mary McHugh volunteered to distribute flyers. Cathy said anyone who is interested can take charge of more advertising (post flyers, local paper, KRoot) Flyers. All members can print up the flyers to post at various locations and distribute to friends.
- * Registration: You can register online or use the mail-in address on the flyer [Registration form/flyer is on page 7 of this newsletter.]
- * Kitchen: Cathy, Mary, and Ashley Ahearn will go through supply trailer and will form a sub-committee for purchase of food/groceries. Bennet said MVBCH is purchasing two new grills similar to the ones we already have
- * Auction: Shelly and Rick Jones are in charge of the auction. They want it noted in the minutes that they are in charge of the auction only, not the entire Spring Ride. Rick would like all the donated items for the auction in one place. Call him to give him the items and he will put them in storage (509) 699-3797. Rick has made a list of members who have solicited items from various merchants in the past and another list of merchants who have never been solicited and hopes to organize things so that no merchant is solicited more than once. He is working with Linda Seaman to produce a tri-fold promotional brochure that can be given to donors and he will have gift certificates available at the next meeting.
- * Coffee station: The coffee station needs an additional person. Mike Murray is in charge of purchasing a new coffee maker
- * Logo Wear: Michelle said she is not ordering any more large and extra large sizes of logo wear because there is such a back log of items from past auctions
- * Signage: Mark Brantner is in charge of putting up signs on the way to Beaver Creek Campground

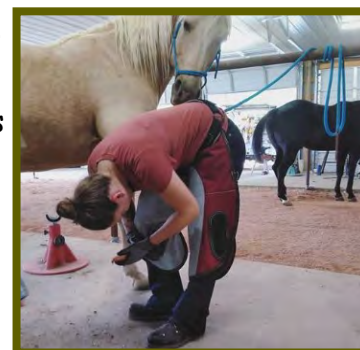

MVBCH Reports to the Methow Valley Ranger District for 2021

This is an extract of a letter signed by our Trail Boss Bill Ford and our President Cathy Upper to Chris Furr, Forest Service District Ranger of the Methow Valley Ranger District (MVRD) reporting on Methow Valley BCHW activities for 2021.

MVBCH members contributed 1691.5 volunteer hours on trails (logging out, tread work, brushing) as well as on the Twisp River Horse Camp (TRHC) and the second year of Phase II at the North Summit Horse Camp (NSHC).

The following is an itemized list of trails, projects and hours for 2021 (not including travel time). The trail volunteer hours were allocated to BCHW which will reallocate some hours to the Methow Valley Ranger District.

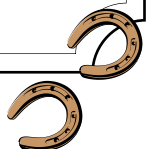

We look forward to completing construction of NSHC Phase II in 2022. It will be complete in the late spring/early summer, depending on the weather. The last remaining projects are installation of the horse water tank and related piping and putting up the last signs.

MVBCH intends to make a large investment of time and finances in the Twisp River Horse Camp in 2022 and beyond. This camp ground was damaged by the 2018 Crescent Mountain Fires. We plan to re-deck the Louis Lake Bridge on South Creek this year.

Because of the Crescent Mountain fire, many trails have not been completely logged out. Also many trailhead roads need to be graded and maintained- especially the road to the East Fork of the Buttermilk # 420. We appreciate our mutual cooperation and the support that MVBCH and BCHW are receiving from the MVRD.



MVBCH JANUARY 13, 2022 MEETING MINUTES (CONT.)

- * MVBCH is sponsoring "Ride Our Part of the State," and we donated a \$490.00 chainsaw.
- * The Trailmeister will have a booth and will be giving several presentations. He has a website where we can advertise the NSHC and possibly provide maps for the various trails out of the camp.
- * There will be a tack sale where BCHW takes 10%. Cathy wants to take the pack boxes donated by Jane Gilbertson to the sale.
- * There will be a first aid course.

Miscellaneous:

- * MVBCH still needs a Volunteer Hours chairperson.
- * Bill Ford said that if you get 16+ volunteer hours, the USFS will give you a free forest pass
- * If you want sawyer certification, Pete Stoothoff will be doing training in May and you need to get on the list
