From your Director, Jim Anderson

Hello all

As I reported at the January meeting the BCHW Board of Directors approved the formation of an Executive Committee to handle the day to day business of BCHW. Typically business that couldn't be handled by the President or Treasurer had to wait until one of the quarterly Board of Directors meetings but that will change. The President is the head of the Ex. Committee and the Board of Directors still has the final say and gives direction to the Ex. Comm. The Ex. Comm. will be made up of the President, Treasurer, Secretary, three chapter directors and three non-directors. An Implementation comm. has been formed to rewrite the BCHW By-Laws to make this all legal. This should be accomplished by June and the final vote to approve should happen at the June BOD meeting.

Committees I'm on: The Silver Star Vision committee is meeting monthly to keep the ball rolling on designing a vision for recreation in the Silver Star area. Players in-

involved are the Forest Service, DNR, WTA, BCHW, CTA, Tribes, NW Fishers and Hunters, CATS, and Native Plant Society. That's a lot of members. The goal is to figure out the trails and old roads and how to use and maintain them. That might involve rerouting some of them or major reconstruction. Currently the Forest Service and DNR aren't committed to do anything with what we come up with but they do agree there needs to be a plan.

The Sustainable Trails Committee headed up by the Forest Service deals with all of the trails in the Gifford Pinchot Nat. Forest. We are just getting started and laying out the ground work and goals. As the name implies the F.S. wants to review all trails as to use and sustainability and to make a plan for them.

The Public Lands Committee is a little quite right now although these other committees are public land issues.

We had a small and short work party at Battle Ground Lake. Five of us cut out trees and brush brought down by the snow storm that the parks personnel hadn't got yet.

With all of the snow in the moun-

tains this winter I'm sure there will be plenty to do at Kalama this next year. We will be holding the 2nd annual Kalama H.C. work party from June 23rd to 26th to not only do clean up but some reconstruction of trails. WTA and the Mt. St. Helens Institute will be joining us. Prior to that we will need to do the usual camp maint. and start logging out some of the worst trees on the trails.

Events: Up coming is the Washington State Horse Expo at the Clark Co. Event Center from March 4th to 6th. We will do set up on the 3rd at noon. We will be doing some live animal packing demonstrations this year.

The BCHW Rendezvous is March 18th to 20th in Ellensburg at the Kittitas Co. Fair Grounds. We will be running the Used Tack Sale again. Registration is required but there is no charge. Dinner Sat. night with a live auction. Check it out at BCHW.org.

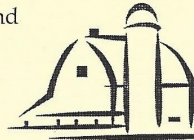
